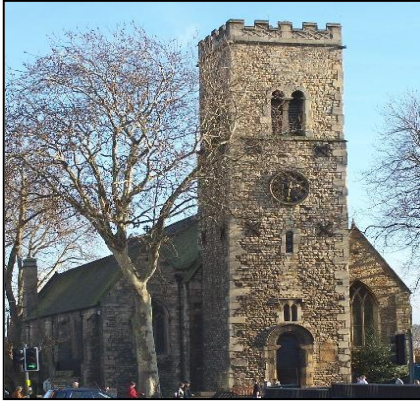

Lincoln, the home of two canonised saints, St Hugh of Lincoln and St Gilbert of Sempringham, could once boast a cathedral and over fifty churches. There have been churches and chapels here since the days of the Emperor Constantine, when an already established Bishop of Lindum Colonia attended the Council of Arles in 314 AD.

Highlights Included in Your Tour

Lincoln Cathedral, one of the most important Medieval cathedrals in England, if not Europe.

St. Peter at Gowts, The church includes a Norman tower, apparently from the original structure.

St Mary Le Wigford Church. This church dates to the late

Saxon period, with a tall tower that may date to 980 AD.

Jews House is a two storied stone building dating from 1158 and reputed to be the oldest domestic building in Britain. Next door the Court sits on the site of a medieval synagogue.

The Greyfriars - Recent research suggests that this building is one of the earliest surviving Franciscan friary churches in Europe and the oldest friary building in England.

Lincoln Quaker meeting house built in 1689. The oldest non-conformist place of worship in Lincoln.
